## Mobility Orange Bargaining

- Bargaining for the Mobility Orange contract began on Jan. 12, 2026, and the contract's expiration date was Feb. 13 at 11:59pm CT.
- Prior to the expiration, we reached an agreement for a one-week contract extension.
  - On Feb. 20, we reached an agreement for a second contract extension through March 6.
  - On March 6, we reached an agreement for a third contract extension through March 20.
  - On March 20, we reached an agreement for a fourth contract extension through April 3.
  - On April 3, we reached an agreement for a fifth **contract extension through April 17.**
- The CWA shared results of a strike authorization vote on March 18. This does not mean a work stoppage is imminent. It simply means the union members have voted to say that a work stoppage could occur at a future date.
- The Mobility Orange contract covers about **9,000 employees** who primarily work in retail, call center, and customer service roles across **36 states**.
- These employees are represented by the Communications Workers of America (CWA) Districts 1, 2-13, 4, 7, and 9.
- Over the past three weeks, employees covered by the **Midwest Core, Legacy T Core, and Legacy T Puerto Rico** contracts have all voted to ratify new agreements, which will be effective on April 12, 2026.
